



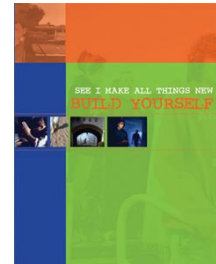

Available Programs

7th grade Chastity Curriculum – “See, I Make All Things New”

A curriculum for schools and parish programs that focuses on virtue and the beauty of human sexuality while discussing the realities associated with an unchaste lifestyle. The program begins with a presentation to the parents to introduce the curriculum and explaining the need for such a program. The student instruction includes readings, videos, and interactive demonstrations to engage the students.



Young Adult Speaker Program

Volunteers consisting of college students and young adults offer two 60-90 minute presentations for Religious Education/ Youth Programs at parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Boston.



Respect for Life – Presents the beauty of human life from conception through natural death. Touches briefly on many of the widely known life issues, but focuses mostly on issues relating to the unborn.

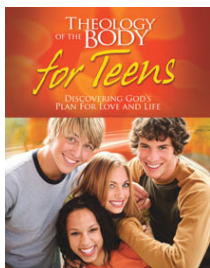
Chastity/ Respect for Sexuality – Discusses the call to live the virtue of chastity respective to our vocation. The theological, emotional, and physical reasons behind chastity are presented with a brief introduction to the Theology of the Body.

Jason Evert Presentations

Internationally known chastity speaker, Jason Evert, visits the Archdiocese of Boston twice each year for a series of speaking engagements with middle and high school age students in schools and parishes. His seventy-five minute presentation, “Romance Without Regret,” is an engaging, fast-paced mix of stories, humor, medical facts and spiritual inspiration rooted in our Catholic faith.



Theology of the Body for Teens



Theology of the Body for Teens presents the two hottest topics on the planet--God and sex--and "marries" them through Pope John Paul II's compelling vision for love and life. Using a great mix of stories, real-life examples, activities, prayers, and references to the culture that teens understand, *Theology of the Body for Teens* answers the questions teens have about their own bodies, issues on sexual morality, and how they were uniquely created for greatness. A pilot of this curriculum for high school age students is currently being conducted in schools and parishes in the Archdiocese of Boston.
